Individuals will receive structured, evidence-based psychosocial interventions tailored to their needs, focusing on recovery goals. These interventions can be delivered in group sessions, one-to-one, or in case management sessions, by trained and qualified staff. Harm Reduction services for rural clients are available including 'Spike on a Bike' taking clean works to people in their communities.
